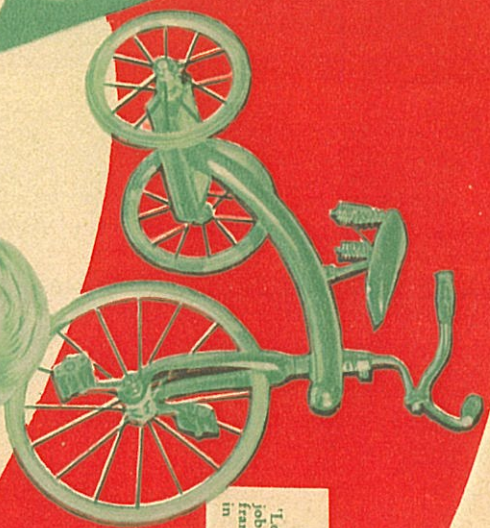


No. 44—"SNAPPY-BOY" WAGON

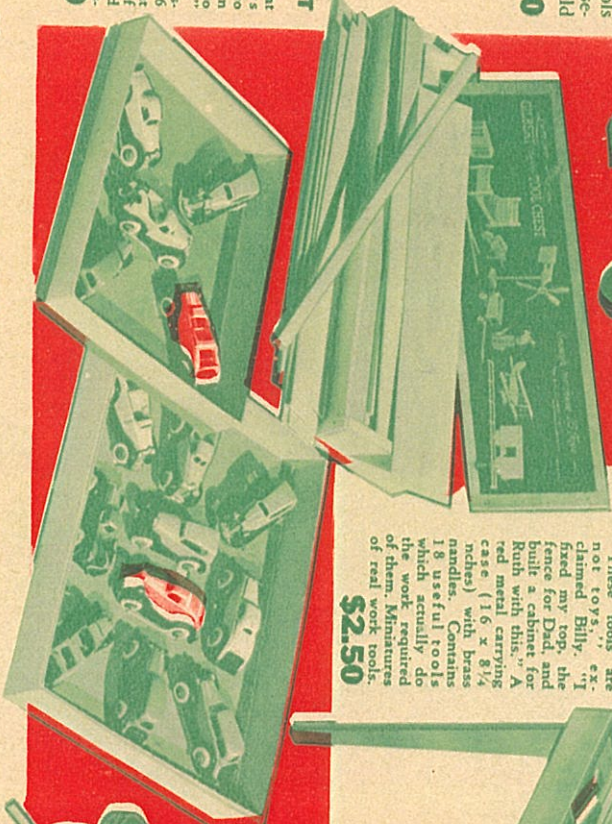
No. 56—GILBERT LUMBER KIT

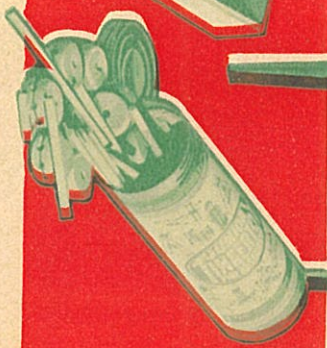
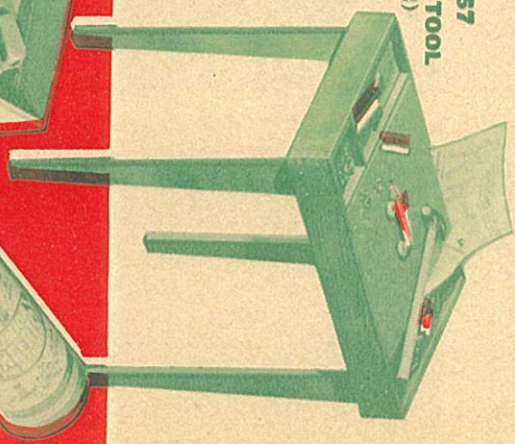
