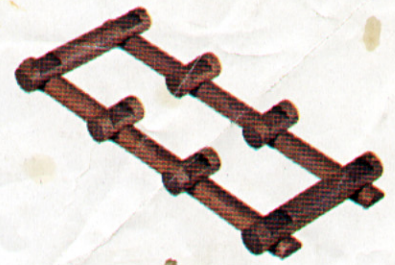


# LINCOLN LOGS, *America's*

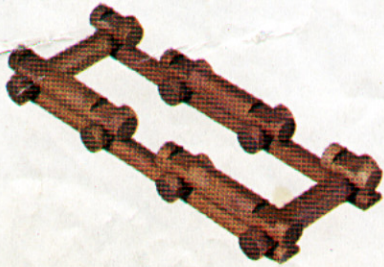
*National Toy*, truly embodies the heritage of America's Western Frontier. Your set contains the authentic, round  $\frac{3}{4}$ " multiple unit system of miniature logs which are exactly like those cut by the pioneers to build their cabins and forts. All logs are finished in harmless, water-soluble colors, and the sets are interchangeable. For building more elaborate models add another set of Logs. Following are some step-by-step instructions to start you off.



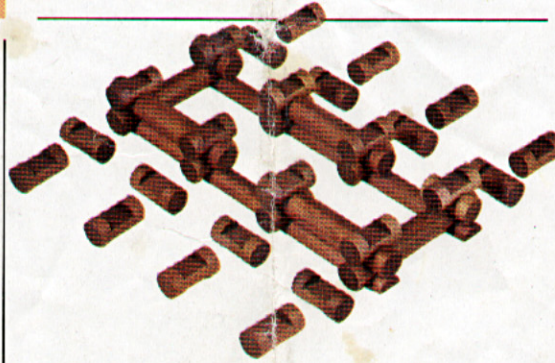
1. Place half logs on the table or floor for a sturdy foundation. All structures should start with half logs.



2. Place the 2 notch logs (or 3 notch logs if your set includes them) across the half logs at the ends. Fill in notches of the half logs with small one notch logs.



3. Place the 2 notch logs across the small one notch log in front and back as shown. Start the doors with small one notch logs at each corner in the back.



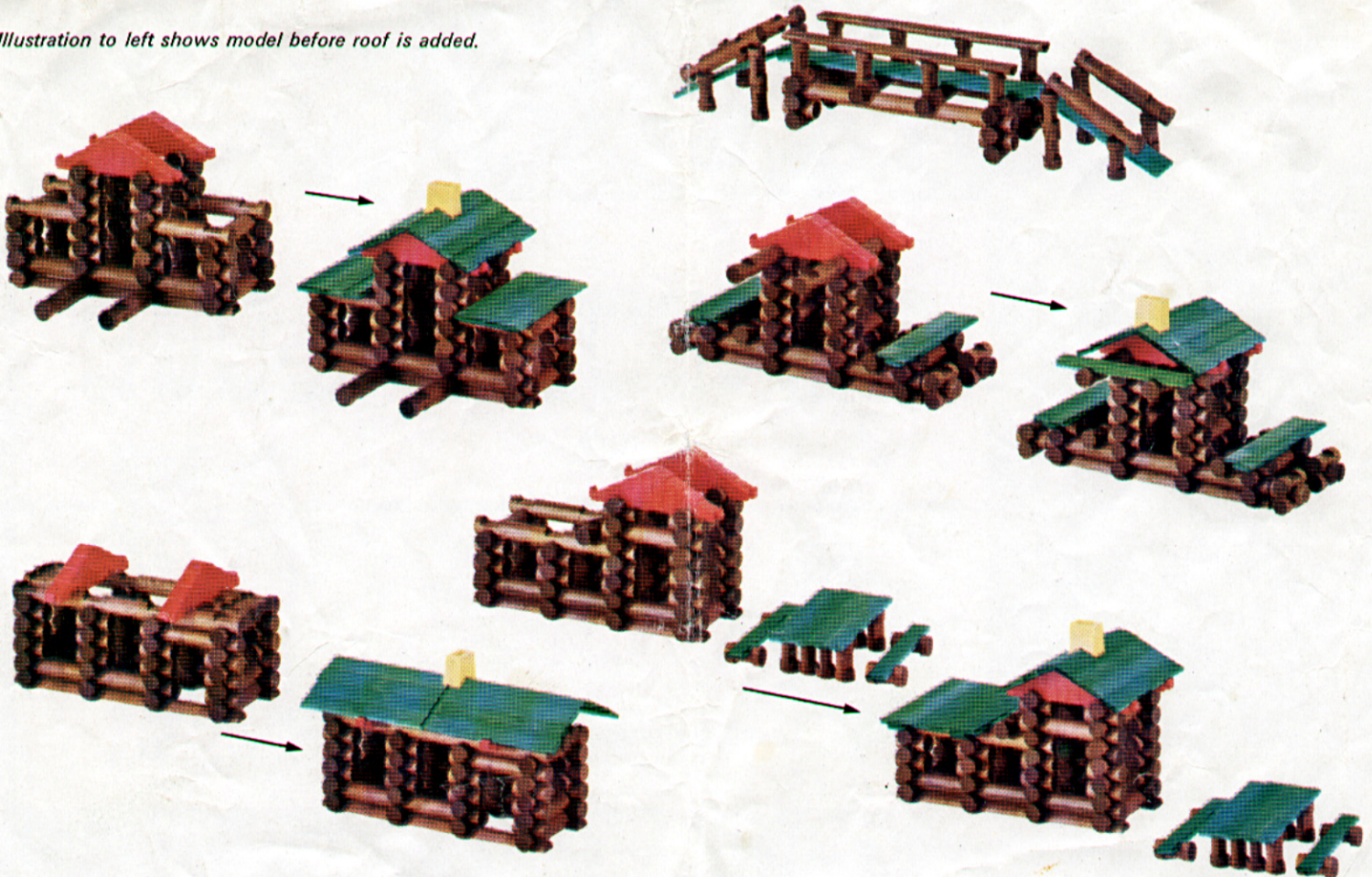
4. We have laid out enough of the small one notch logs to finish doors for the next three layers of your building. Note how easily they interlock as you use them.



5. Finish the top by using a 2 notch log at the rear and additional small one notch logs in the remaining spaces so that your cabin is the same height on the ends.

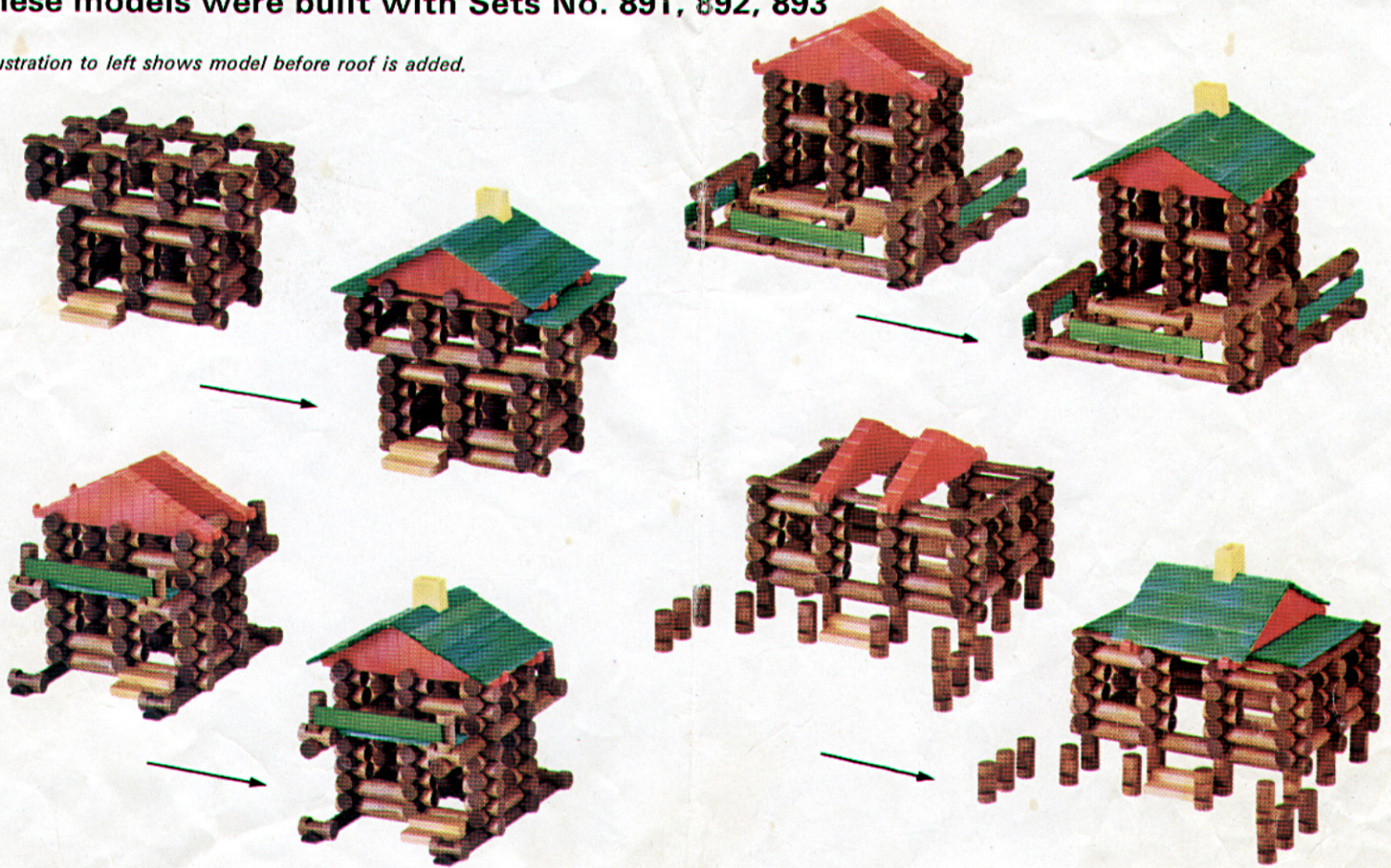

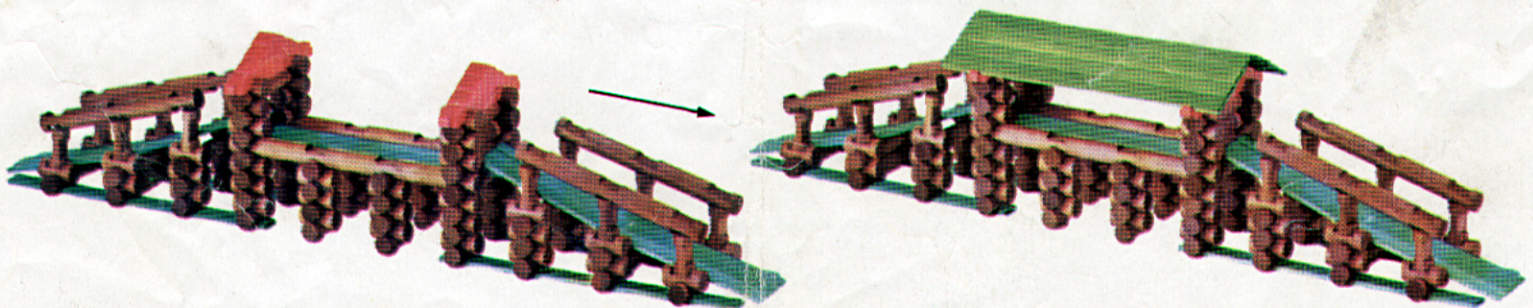

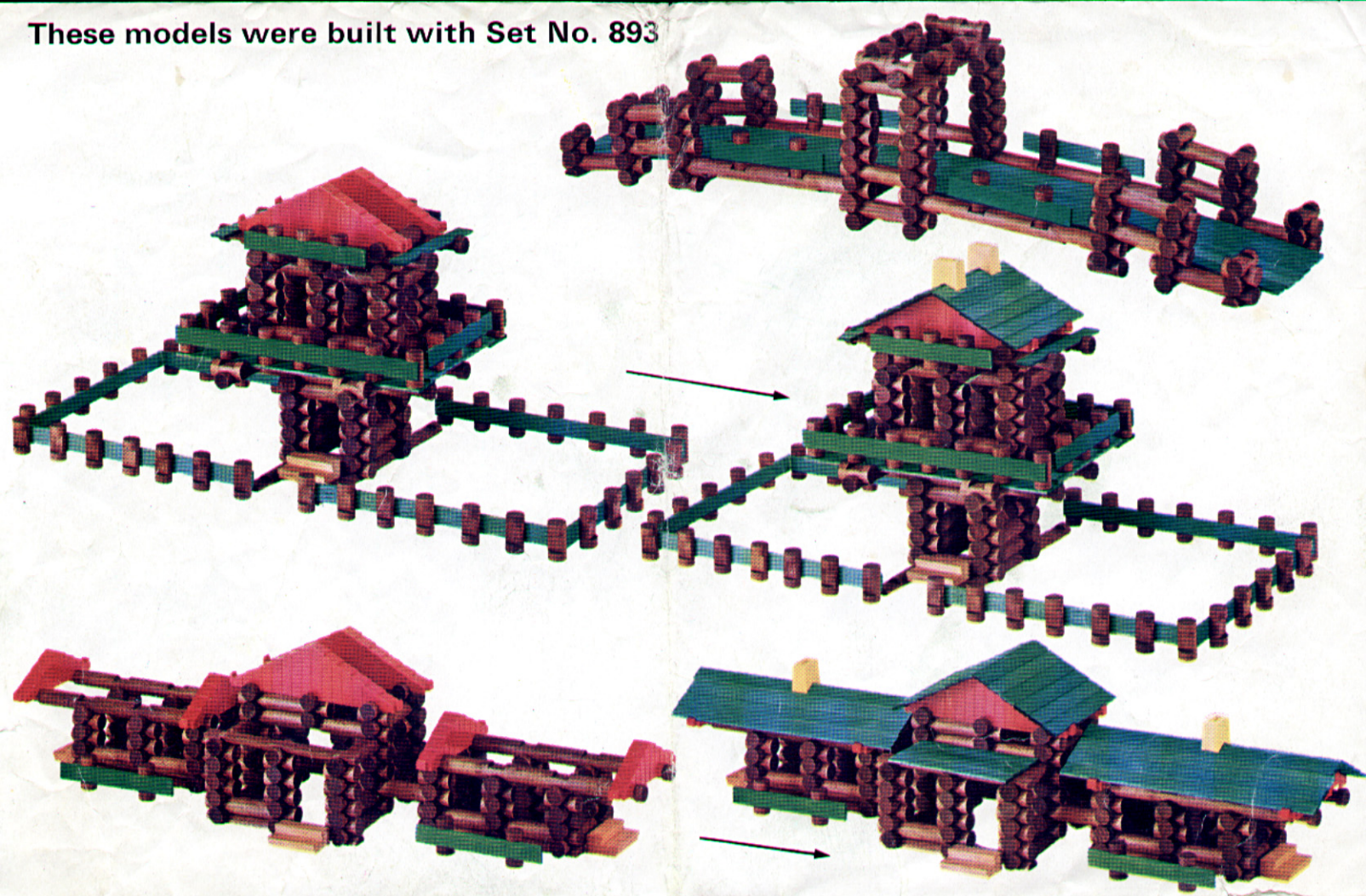
