
Match'Em The Memory Card Game








Peg Puzzle



Around the World Air Race




Witzi-Wits The Fortune Teller




Herman F. Mack & Bro.

It is made up of three bean bags of red, blue and yellow and a specially. constructed deck with hinged heads, so that after being struck they will move back into place. It is 10 inches wide by 19 inches high and retails for \$1.00. Mr. Quack-Duck, shown at the right of the picture, is another \$1.00 retailer and is typical of the line of Wooden Action Pull Toys that will be found in this display. Mr. Quack-Duck is 10 inches high, is 8 inches long and is attractively finished in green, blue, yellow and red. He has a lacquered wooden neck, stained with tumbled wax finish, and an ingenious voice device that makes for a realistic quackquack as it is pulled along.




